Carol Jarrard 1982 AIAW First Team

It only seemed fitting for Carol Jarrard-Enfield to climax a brilliant basketball career at Truman with all-American honors.

The 6-1 center was named to the 1981-82 AIAW Division II all-American first-team.

That season, she led the Bulldogs to an MAIAW State Championship and to a berth in the NCAA Division II South Central Regional and AIAW Region 6 Tournament.

Enfield averaged 19.8 points and 10.7 rebounds a game. She ranked 11th in the nation in scoring and was 14th in free throw percentage with a .780 mark.

Enfield is the only Truman woman to earn first-team all-American accolades. She was also selected three times to the AIAW

all-Region 6 team.

She concluded her career with 2,006 points and 1,084 rebounds in 112 games. Enfield is still the school's career leader in five offensive categories, including scoring, and she is second in career rebounding.

Enfield was the first woman inducted into the Truman Hall of Fame in October of 1992.





Amy Eagan 1999 Daktronics Honorable Mention

Amy Eagan became the second Bulldog all-American in 1999 when she was named honorable mention to the Daktronics and Basketball Bulletin all-American teams.

Eagan was the team leader on the 1998-99 squad which set a school record with 22 wins and advanced to the NCAA regional finals.

In 1998-99, Eagan averaged 17.4 points,

5.0 rebounds and 5.9 assists a game. She set a school record with 177 made throws that year and had the second-most assist and fourth-most steals at Truman for a single-season. She was named first-team all-MIAA as well at the end of the season.

For her career, Eagan finished with 1,527 points, 643 rebounds

and 529 assists. She holds Truman school records with 483 career free throws made, 529 assists and 328 steals, and is third in points. Eagan owns the MIAA record with 704 career free throw attempts.





Kelli Kreuser 2000 WBCA Honorable Mention

Kelli Kreuser earned all-American honors during the 1999-00 season when she was named honorable mention to the Kodak/WBCA all-American team.

Kreuser was a member on the 1998-99 team that won a school-record 22 games and advanced to the NCAA regional finals. In 1999-00, she led Truman to 17 more wins, tying for the third-best in school history.

In her final season, Kreuser led the team with 17.9 points, 6.6 rebounds and a .737 free throw percentage. She earned her second first-team all-MIAA honor following the year.

In just three seasons, Kreuser joined the 1,000-point club with 1,177 career points. She ranks third in Truman history with a 15.5

scoring average and is eighth in points.

Kreuser also ranks seven in field goals made, sixth in field goal percentage and tenth in free throw percentage. She finished with 403 rebounds, 450 field goals made, a .464 field goal percentage and a .721 free throw percentage





Hannah Belanger 2021 WBCA First Team 2023 WBCA (1T)/D2CCCA (HM)

Hannah Belanger is a two-time WBCA All-American after earning the award in 2021 and again in 2023.

Belanger finished her Truman State career as the all-time leader in three-pointers made (294) and was third on the all-time scoring list with 1,882 points in 108 games played.

She tied the single-season school record for points with 638 in her senior campaign, which included a

record 99 three-pointers made in 30 games.

Belanger was the 2023 GLVC Player of the Year and was a

four-time all-GLVC honoree with three first team selections.

Belanger earned the College Sports Communicators Academ-

ic All-America honor and was named the 2023 GLVC Scholar-Athlete for

women's basketball.
Belanger played one
last year at Division I,
lowa State University
and started 32 of 33
games and led the Cy-

clones in three-pointers with 74.
