The Bulldogs took two from Nebras-ka-Omaha in the regional, with the clincher coming on a basehit by Joni Williams scored pinch-runner Renae Waddill for the 1-0 victory in the 13th inning.

The first NCAA final four was held in Bridgeport, Conn. and the Bulldogs were

seeded fourth. Truman fell in the opening game to Sam Houston State (Texas) by a 1-0 score. In the second game of the fournament, the Bulldogs were ousted by Sacred Heart 6-3. Truman had a 3-1 lead after four innings, but three in the fifth and two in the sixth were the difference for Sacred Heart.

Truman finished the season with a 24-17 overall record.

At the regional tournament, the Bulldogs opened up play with a 4-1 win over Augustana College. Truman scored three runs in the top of the first and never looked back. They also beat host Wayne State by a 4-0 score with Kongable picking up the win. A run in the top of the seventh gave the Bulldogs the regional title against Augustana the next day.

Truman dropped their first game at the Final Four by a 1-0 score, with the lone run coming in the top of the sixth inning against Bloomsburg (Pa.).

In the elimination game versus California State-Northridge, Kongable allowed just two hits but two runs scored in the first and the team fell 2-1.
